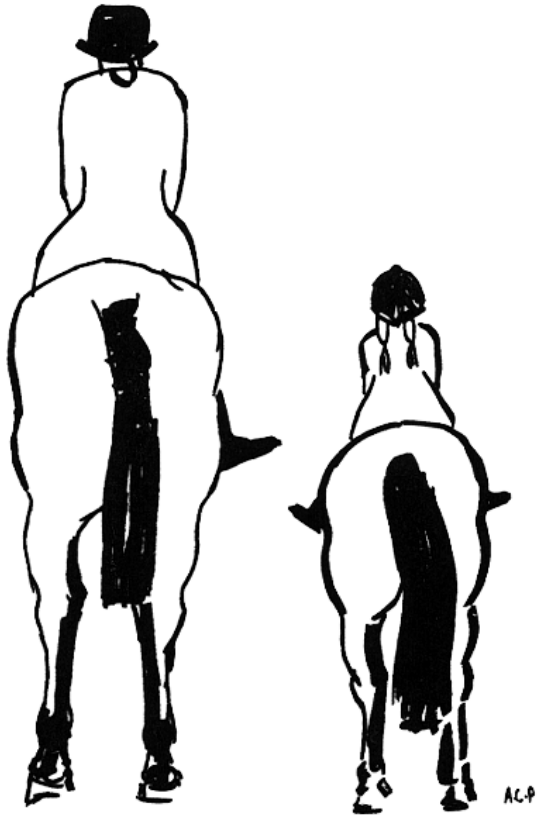

A brief history of “A Day in the Country” ...

The first “Day in the Country” horse show was held in the Fall of 1953 on the estate of Mr. Alvin Untermeyer, on Taconic Road in Greenwich (now the Andrews Farm development). In later years, the show was held at the Heron Estate on Lake Avenue, Andrews Farm, and for many years now, the show’s home has been the lovely Milliken property.

Although a benefit for the Greenwich Riding and Trails Association, the true purpose of A Day in the Country has always been to provide a day of true enjoyment for all ages, equestrian or simply equine enthusiast.

The morning classes consist of more traditional horse show classes for children and adults. After lunch is when the real fun begins, however, with family classes, a costume class, “lucky buck”, Bloody Mary, among other perennial favorites.

U.S. Equestrian Federation Entry Agreement

By entering a U.S. Equestrian Federation-recognized Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulteur or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of U.S. Equestrian Federation (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation Rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See Art. 1502.5.

U.S. Equestrian Federation Release, Assumption of Risk, Waiver and Indemnification

This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

I AGREE in consideration for my participation in this Competition to the following:

I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse, as a rider, driver, handler, vaulteur, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death ("Harm").

I AGREE to release the Federation and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

I have read the Federation Rules about protective equipment, including GR318 and GR1713, and I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty and I acknowledge that the Federation strongly encourages me to do so while WARNING that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries.

If I am a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation and AGREE to all of the above provisions and AGREE to assume all of the obligations of this Release on the child's behalf.

I AGREE that "the Federation" and "Competition" as used above includes all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and affiliated organizations. I represent that I have the requisite training, coaching and abilities to safely compete in this competition.

I AGREE that if I am injured at this competition, the medical personnel treating my injuries may provide information on my injury and treatment to the Federation on the official USEF accident/injury report form.

BY SIGNING BELOW, I AGREE to be bound by all applicable Federation Rules and all terms and provisions of this entry blank.

*In addition, I agree to abide by all rules listed under the "Rules" section of the prizelist for the above listed show. I understand that I am responsible for my own errors or omissions.

Should the horse show get fined by any organization for my error, I agree to reimburse the horse show for monies owed.

Class 1—Children's Equitation "B" Fences. Fence height 2'

Class 2—Children's Equitation "B" Fences. Fence height 2'

Class 3—Children's Equitation "B" Flat

Children's Hunter Division (2' and 2'6" height)—Champion and reserve. Open to horses and ponies. Helen Castles Memorial Trophy awarded to the highest point winner.

Class 4—Children's Hunter Fences

Class 5—Children's Hunter Fences

Class 6—Children's Hunter Under Saddle

Children's Equitation Division "A" (2'6" height)—Champion and Reserve. Open to horses and ponies. Riders may not cross enter into the 2' Equitation Division. Bolling Perpetual Trophy to be awarded to the highest point rider.

Class 7—Children's Equitation "A" Fences. Fence height 2'6"

Class 8—Children's Equitation "A" Fences. Fence height 2'6"

Walk/Trot Division—Champion and Reserve. Misty My Love Perpetual Trophy to be awarded to the highest point rider. Riders ineligible for other classes except Family Class, Pairs Walk Trot, and Costume Class

Class 13—Walk/Trot Equitation

Class 14—Walk/Trot Equitation

Class 15—Walk/Trot Pleasure

Class 16—Leadline Class. Riders ineligible for other classes except Family Class & Costume Class.

Class 17—Pairs Over Fences. Horses to be ridden tandem. Last fence taken abreast. Lalande McC. Keeshan Perpetual Memorial Trophy

Class 18—Pairs Walk, Trot. Performance and appearance to count.

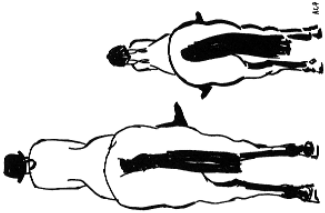
Class 19—Bloody Mary Class. 21 years or older. To be judged at the walk, trot, canter and jump. First prize to the rider left with the fullest glass.

Class 20—Cola Classic. Riders 20 years old or younger. To be judged at the walk, trot, canter and over fences. First prize to the rider left with the fullest glass.

Class 21—Lucky Buck. Open to all ages. We provide a buck under the knee. First prize wins 50% of receipts. Walk, trot, canter and jump while riding bareback.

Class 22—Costume Class. Open to all ages, riders and non-riders. Helmets required on horseback. Ribbons to be awarded.
